 Reflective — I provide opportunities for students to "think about their thinking." (Metacognition)
<b>Exciting</b> — My lessons are engaging and inspire experiential learning. I provide opportunities for student choice.
Safe — My students are encouraged to take risks and understand that making a mistake is part of the learning process. I promote acceptance, rather than judgment, and value individuality.
Purposeful — My classroom is designed to promote both left-brain and right-brain thinking skills.
 Organized — My classroom is organized so that students share in the responsibility for their learning.
Nurturing — I base my instructional strategies on student learning styles and Multiple Intelligence Theory.
Spontaneous — I am open to new ideas, innovation, and exploration. I value "Teachable Moments."
Inviting — I provide a wide range of materials related to developing student interests and talents.
 <b>Venturesome</b> — I sometimes plan simulations that take students on learning adventures and challenge them to solve problems and collaborate. I integrate the Arts into my instruction.
<b>Enigmatic</b> — My classroom provides opportunities for discovery, critical thinking, and inquiry.  I promote interdisciplinary connections.
