14. CHOICE MENUS

• What is it?

An instructional approach whereby students are offered a variety of learning options in order to show their academic progress and/or mastery of the standards

• Why use it?

- Promotes student ownership and accountability
- ✓ Utilizes a variety of *learning styles* and preferences
- ✓ Allows students to personalize content
- Creates meaningful learning experiences for students

• How do I plan?

- Incorporate tasks that will challenge various learning levels and learning profiles.
- 2. Create specific guidelines for menu options and review them with students.
- 3. Ensure students understand how their learning task choices will be assessed.
