35. EXIT CARDS

What is it?

A post-assessment strategy used to gather information about knowledge students have gained about a particular topic

Why use it?

- Provides a quick and easy method of assessment
- ✓ Challenges students to think critically about the lesson

• How do I plan?

- 1. Model the strategy for students the first time it is used.
- 2. Distribute index card or small piece of paper at the end of the lesson.
- Allow time for students to record what they learned, what they found interesting, questions they still have, etc.
- 4. Have students turn in exit cards or post them in a specific location in the room.
- 5. Be sure to review students' answers in order to better align instruction with their needs.

• Example:

□ Record 3 things you learned, 2 items you found most interesting, and 1 question you still have about today's lesson.
