Whole Class Activity

Read several informational texts about American Jazz. As a whole class, discuss what you have learned. Next, each student will make a four-column chart showing:

- 1. Five famous jazz artists
- 2. Instruments each played
- 3. Songs for which each is famous
- 4. Then each student will listen to at least one recording of the music of each jazz artist listed. In the fourth column, write your impressions of each piece of music.

 - What are some differences between jazz in its early years and jazz today?
- 2. What styles of jazz have been the most popular in the last 100 years?

- 1. Give examples of how at least three American cities (such as New Orleans, Memphis, St. Louis, or Kansas City) have benefitted from jazz.
- Of the many types of jazz, choose the type that most appeals to you. Make an outline showing the highlights of its development and history, and give examples of the music highlighted in this type of jazz.
