Squirrels in the School by Ben M. Baglio


There are three kinds of squirrels – flying, ground, and tree. Flying squirrels do not fly but glide. They have a fold of skin under their arms that looks like a wing. The grey squirrel and red squirrel are considered tree squirrels. They spend most of their days climbing up and down trees.
