
T. Roosevelt established many national parks, forests, and reserves. How many did he designate? How much land do they cover?



For what other laws is T. Roosevelt known for passing during his presidency? Who were his famous relatives?




The first National Park was established in 1872. Where is it? Which president set the land aside?
